*HAIB* publishes peer-reviewed innovative, original, high-quality research articles including empirical and evidence-based methods (e.g., clinical, experimental and applied research), quantitative/empirical work, small sample size & single subject investigations, epidemiologic, and qualitative and descriptive investigations. In order to make the publication accessible to both practitioners and scientific researchers, contributions are encouraged from the broad spectrum of investigative techniques utilized by the social sciences and humanities. All submissions undergo a blind review process, and those selected for publication will be distributed electronically.
